You may be surprised to learn that you don't need a degree in accounting, finance, or business to study for the ACA (Association of Chartered Accountants) qualification, in fact, most of our trainees come from a non-accountancy higher education background and some also join us after completing their Level 4 AAT (Association of Accounting Technician) qualifications rather than a degree (see separate brochure).

To apply, you'll need either a 2:1 degree or above (achieved or predicted) in any discipline or the full AAT Level 4 qualification, although we may consider candidates with a 2:2 degree in certain locations if your degree is in a subject relevant to the role.
